Dissertation Fellowship for 2006-2007

The Department of Black Studies at the University of California, Santa Barbara invites applications for two fellowships for the academic year 2006-2007. Applicants must be advanced to candidacy at an accredited university. The department is particularly interested in scholars whose research focuses on intersections of race, class, gender or sexuality in African/Caribbean/African-American or Diasporic Studies.

The duration of the award is nine months and the fellowship grant is \$20,000. Scholars are required to be in residence during the entire fellowship period and there is an expectation that the dissertation will be completed during the term of residency. Dissertation scholars will teach one undergraduate course and present one public lecture.

To apply, submit curriculum vitae, a brief description of the dissertation project, a writing sample (approx. 20 pages) and three letters of reference to:
