

The political fight that has broken out in the US about contraception is both surprising and at the same time traditionally American. It is also part of a global trend of rage against gender transformation, of religious conservatism, and of anxieties about sex. It also has everything to do with a smart black man as President.

Linda Gordon, Florence Kelley Professor of History and University Professor of the Humanities at New York University, is the author of *Woman's Body, Woman's Right: The History of Birth Control in America* which remains the definitive history of birth-control politics in the US and was completely revised and re-published as *The Moral Property of Women*. Her many other award-winning publications include *Heroes of Their Own Lives: The History and Politics of Family Violence, Pitied But Not Entitled: Single Mothers and the History of Welfare, The Great Arizona Orphan Abduction,* and *Dorothea Lange: A Life Beyond Limits.* Gordon served on the Departments of Justice/ Health and Human Services Advisory Council on Violence Against Women for the Clinton administration.
